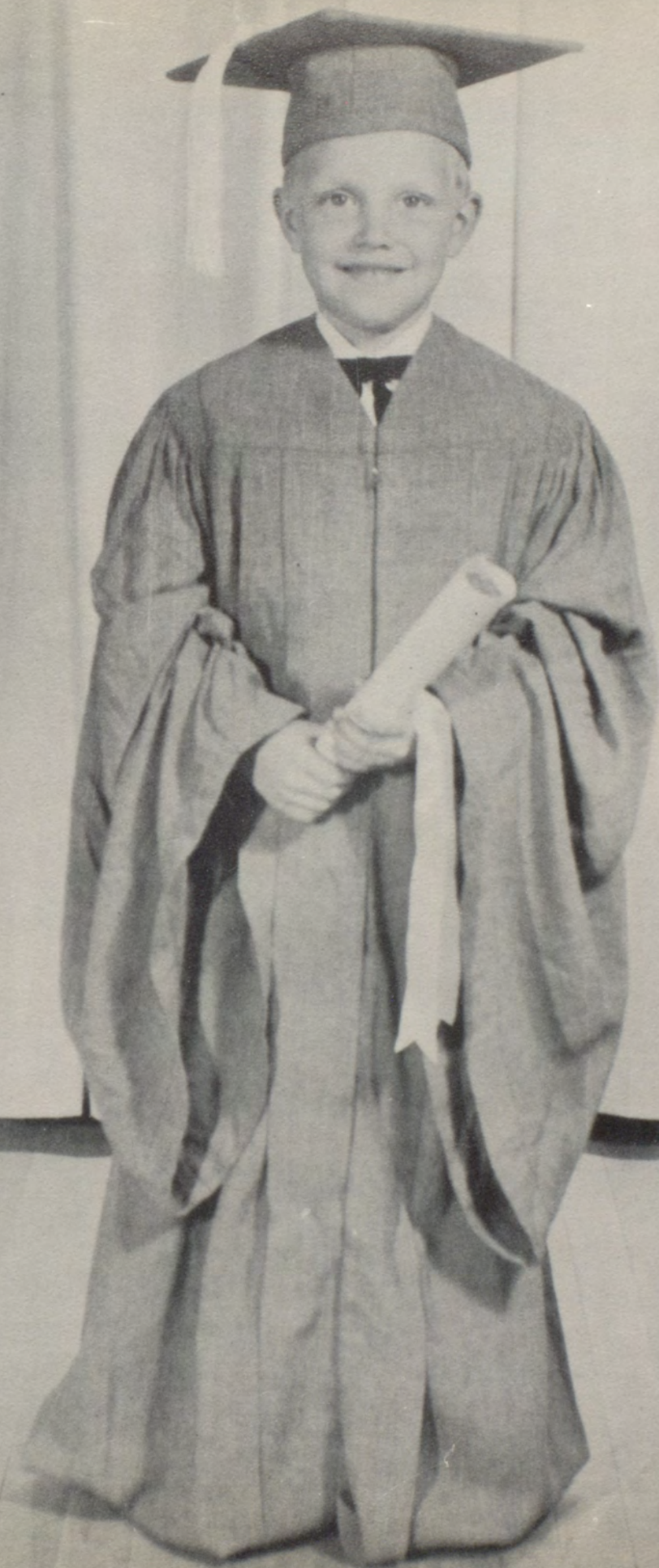
Both Elvis and Pat sing Rock and Roll music, but Elvis would rather sing the faster songs, and Pat leans toward the dreamy numbers.

Frank English, Counselor



Mr. Frank English was the guidance counselor for the 1956-57 school year, devoting one-half of each day to student counseling and one-half to teaching civics.

It is the job of the Counselor to set up and administer the Achievement Test given to all high school students. The Kuder Preference Test is given to Sophomores and is a test given to determine each Sophomore's preference in fields of work and may be helpful in deciding what subjects are best to enroll in for his Junior and Senior years.

The Counselor conducts a Career Day for Juniors and Seniors and alternates with Bowling Green High School with a College Day for all Pike County High Schools. Representatives from all colleges, business schools, and nursing schools interview students that have shown an interest in that particular school.

The Counselor administers the Ohio Psychological Test to Seniors and the California Mental Maturity Test. This year, for the first time, a Student Scholarship Qualifying Test was given to a group of Seniors interested in obtaining scholarships.

The Counselor is assisted by the teaching staff in administering the tests, and while some of the tests are machine scored, others are scored by the Counselor.

The Counselor interviews all Seniors with regard to further schooling or going to work, and has information available on all kinds of jobs and careers with requirements to be met in order to apply for the job.

The Counselor will interpret the test results to any parent and is available for consultation with parents regarding the students school work, finding job opportunities, or for information about going to college.

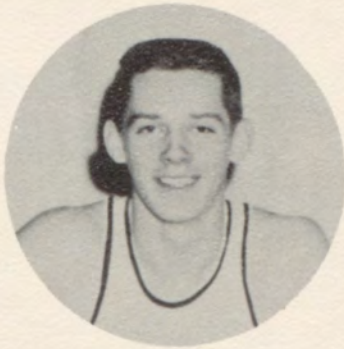
The high scorers for the year were Note Mitchell with 385 points and Bruce Penn with 260 points.

The Bulldogs played their best ball in conference play, winning three and losing three.

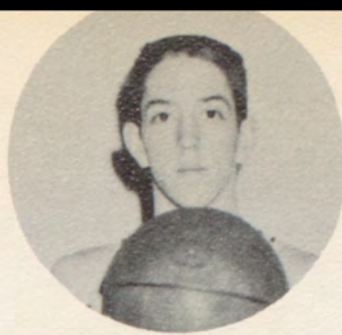

For money-making projects the F.H.A. girls ran a concession stand at every game and a food stand at the Tournament.

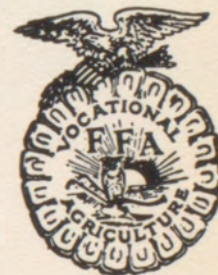

This is a 1930 Model A Ford, with a 1941 flat head V-8 Ford engine. The engine is bored out to 80,000th of an inch, full race camshaft, 9 to 1 ratio rear end, 3 to 1 ratio transmission, stainless steel drive shaft and axles, change from mechanical to hydraulic brakes with high pressure brake drums, 600-16 wheels and tires, dual pipes, and flame job designed and painted by Joe Walker, who helped build this car. It does 0 to 60 miles an hour under 10 seconds, and top speed is over 100 miles an hour. This was made at Henderson's Junk Yard, Smith's Garage, and the School Shop. When dragging, it shifts from low in 40 seconds, 85 to 90, and high time to quit!
