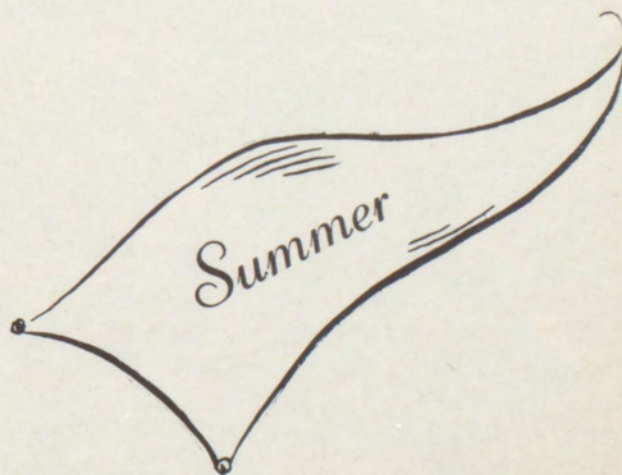

The Board of Education represents six of the outstanding business and professional men of Louisiana.

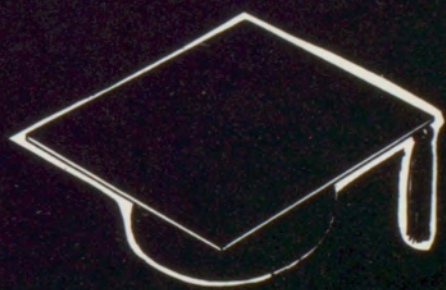

Our money making projects for the past year were: a bake sale, the Sophomore 'April Love' Dance, and concession stands at the football games, basketball games, and the annual Tournament.

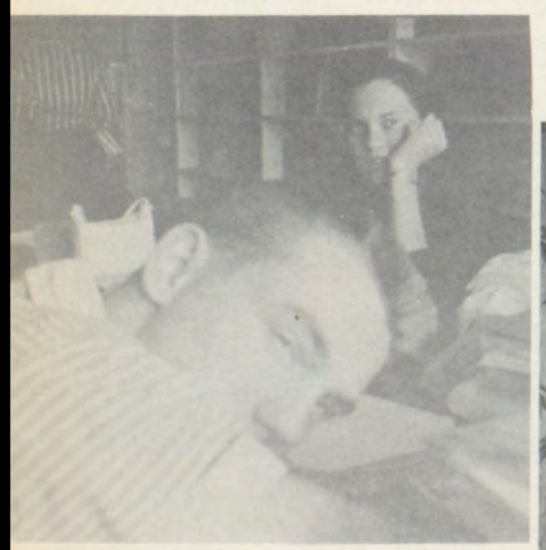

These girls did a fine job and are to be congratulated.

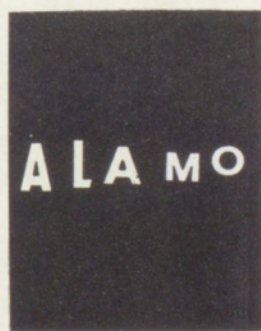

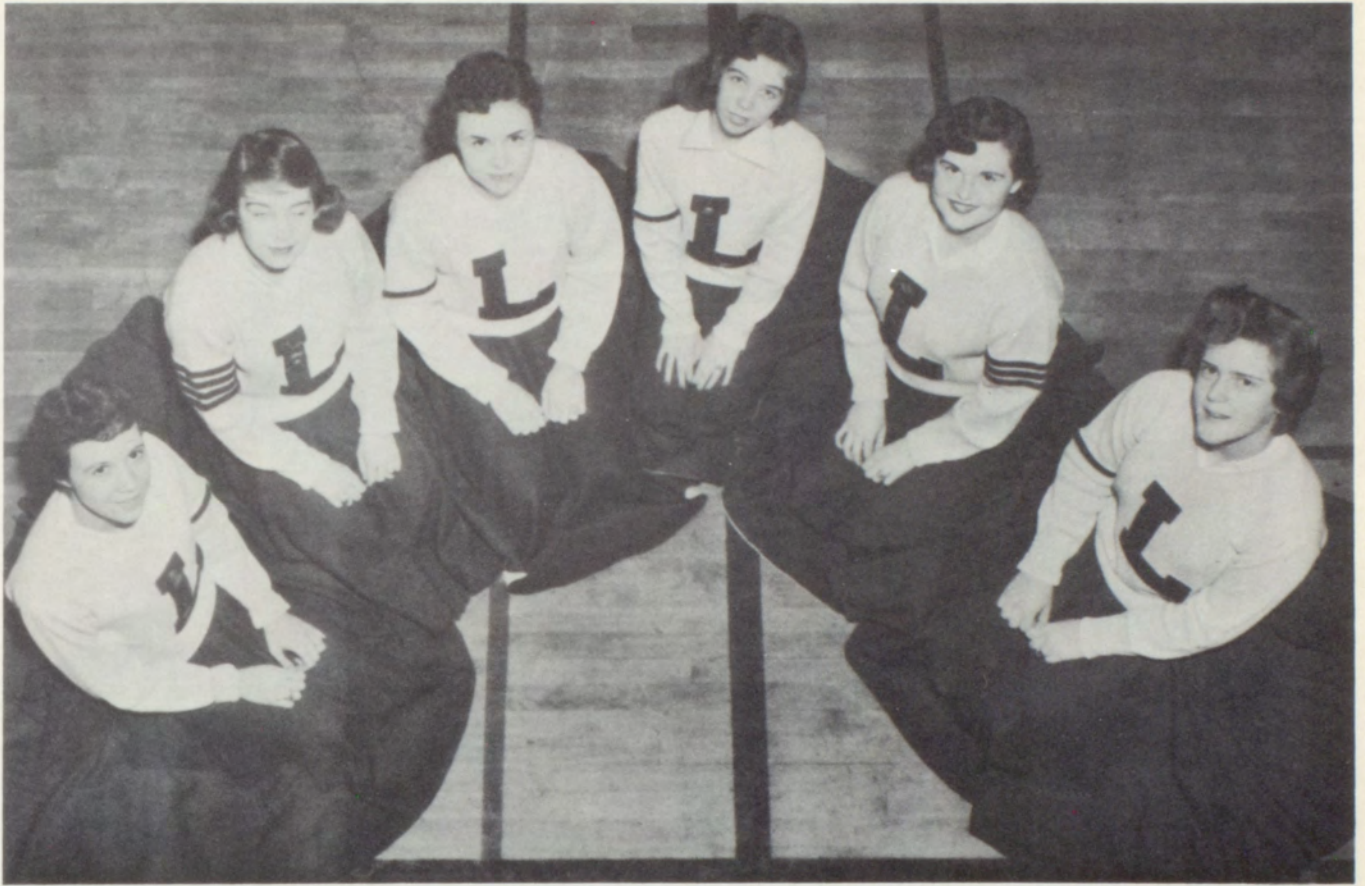
