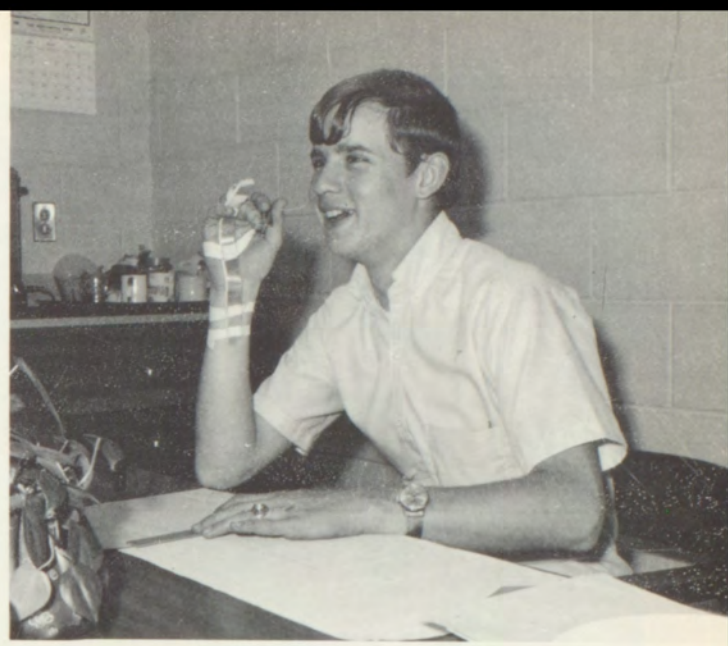


For an individual who has never been a member of the executive staff, it is nearly impossible to realize the extent of the work behind the often ridiculed Alamo.

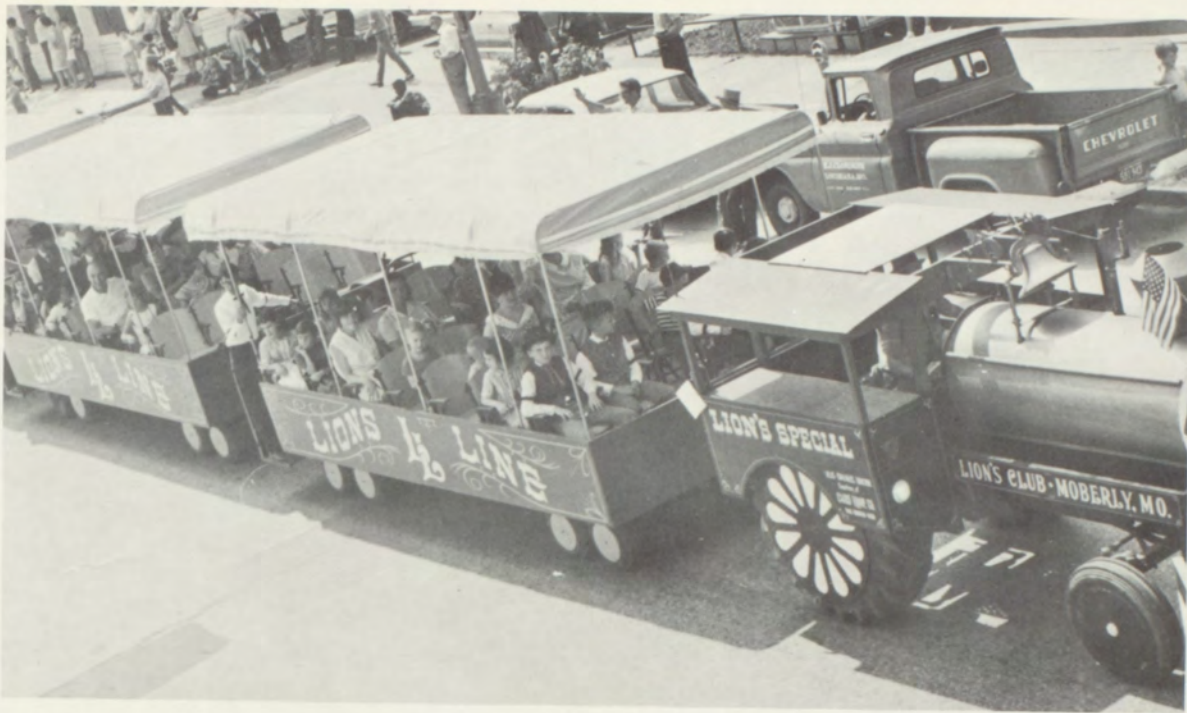

Student Council is a necessary part of student life. Many students do not realize the many advantages they would be without if it were not for the council.

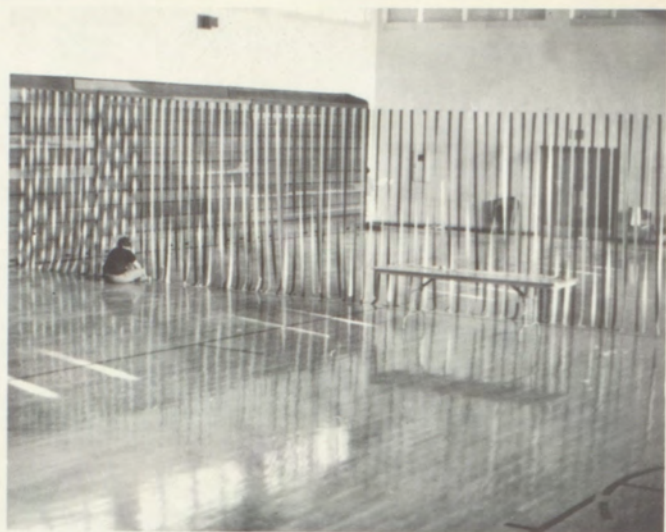
This year there was work to be done in the summer. By taking charge of the Lion's Club Train and participating in Youth Day they made their contribution to Louisiana's Sesquicentennial.

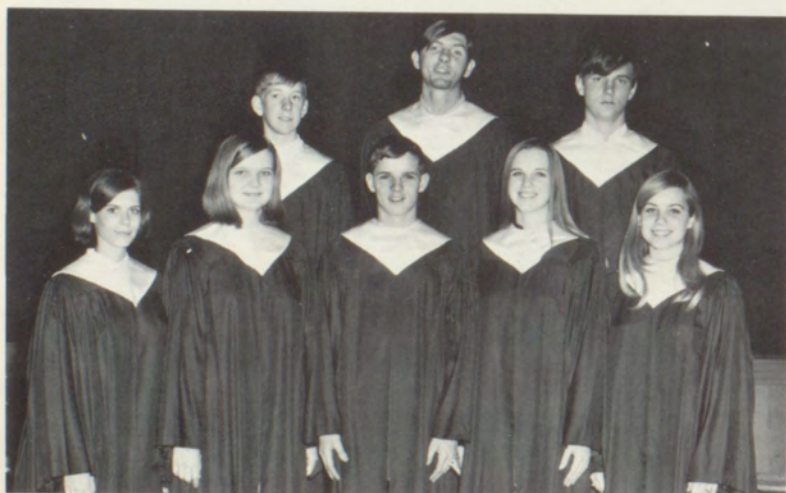
There was also an abundance of fine work done by the large groups. Both the mixed chorus and the girls' glee club received State Rating I, while the boys' glee club was awarded a II.
