To start off, a folk song session put everyone in a good mood for the games that followed.

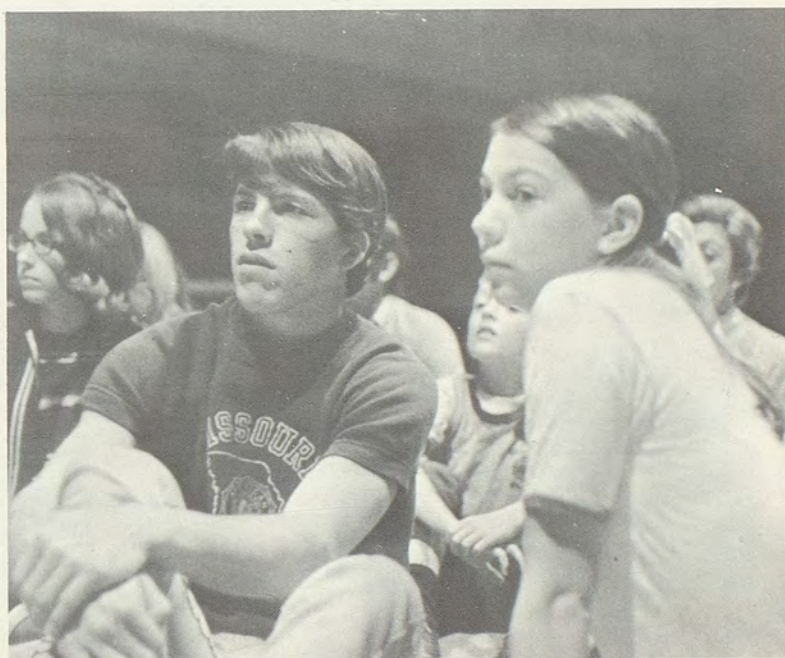
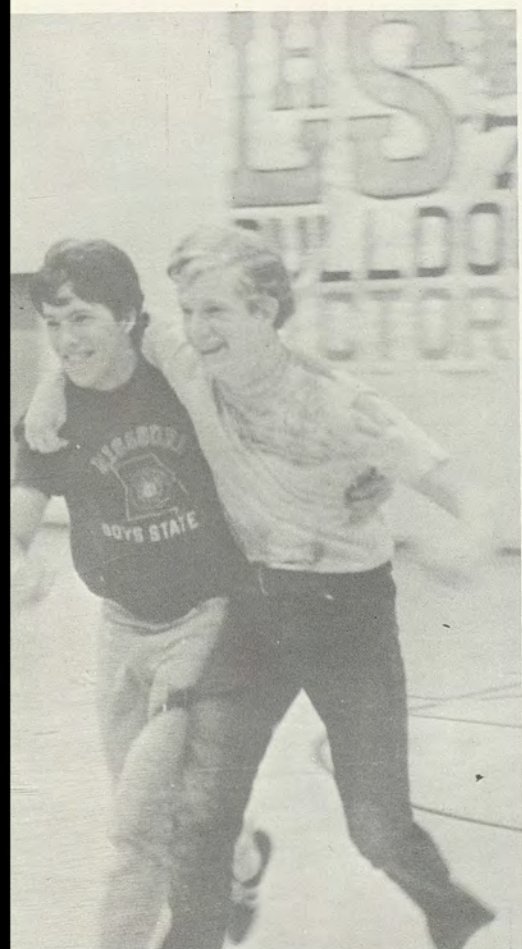

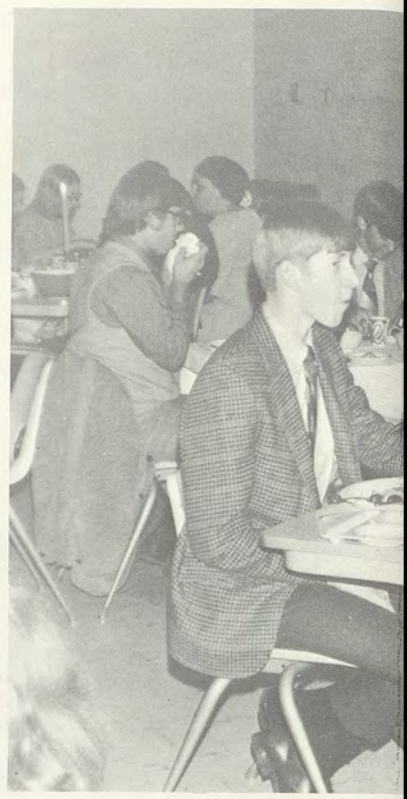

Back to the good ol' days

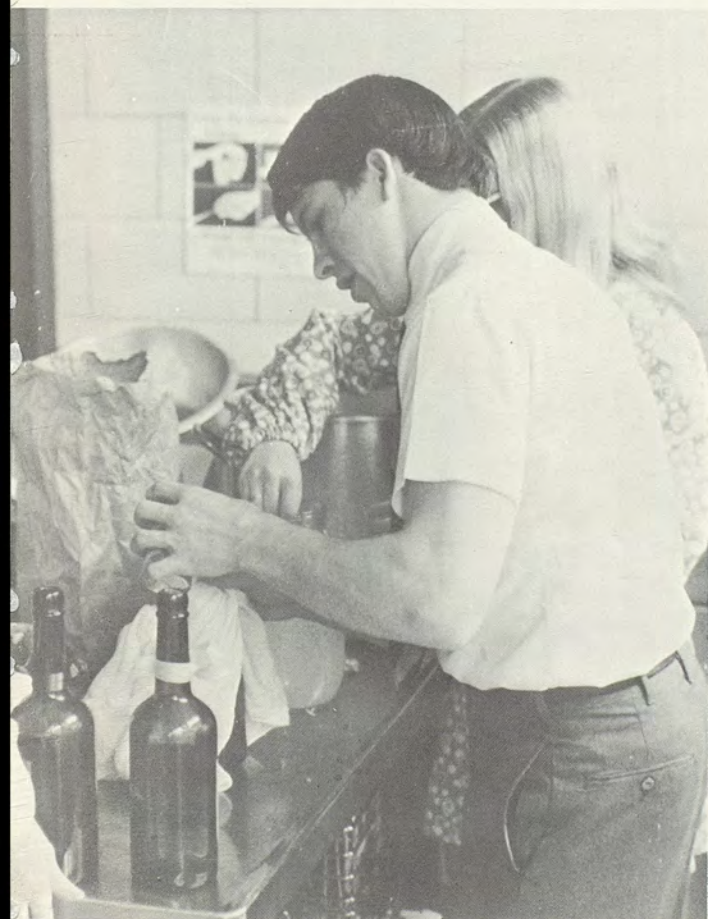

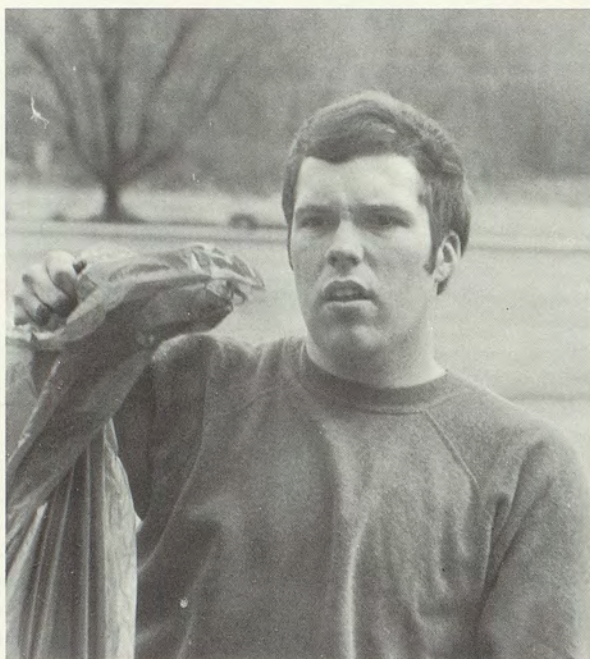

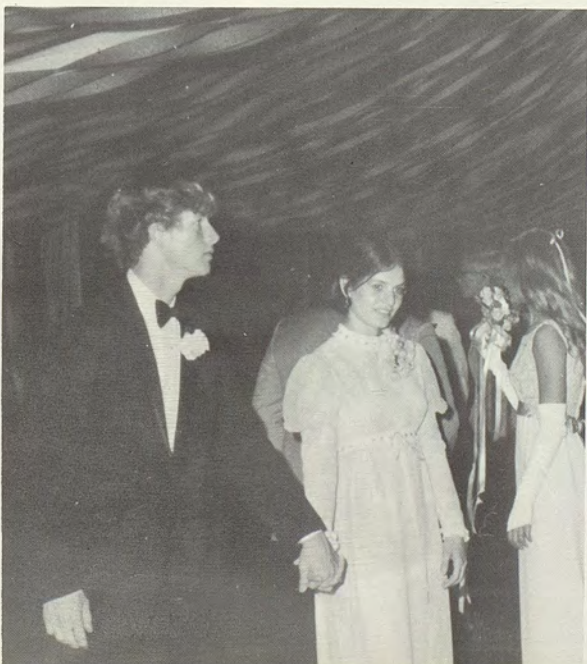
1971 Junior-Senior banquet and prom

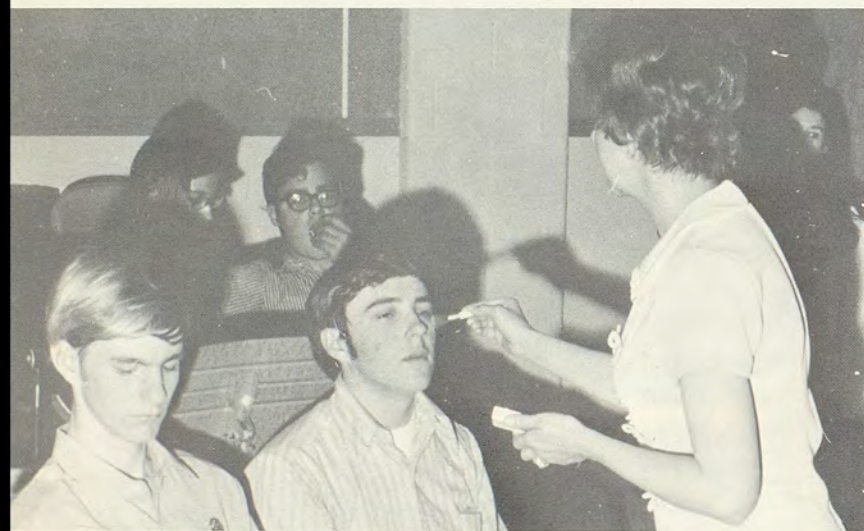
SEVENTIES' INVOLVEMENT
