# Construction is slow

Work began on the construction at both the primary and high school sites in the fall of 1994. However, things did not progress as well as they might have. Delays were the name of the game, including the placing of the gymnasium roof backwards and a rainy spring.

As of late June 1995, plans were still uncertain about the projected opening date of the 1995-'96 school year. According to principal Dan Johnson, the Board of Education had given its okay to delay the start of school

until after Labor Day if the building wasn't completed. Any days beyond that would extend student attendance days into June.

Work is progressing well at the Primary site, however.

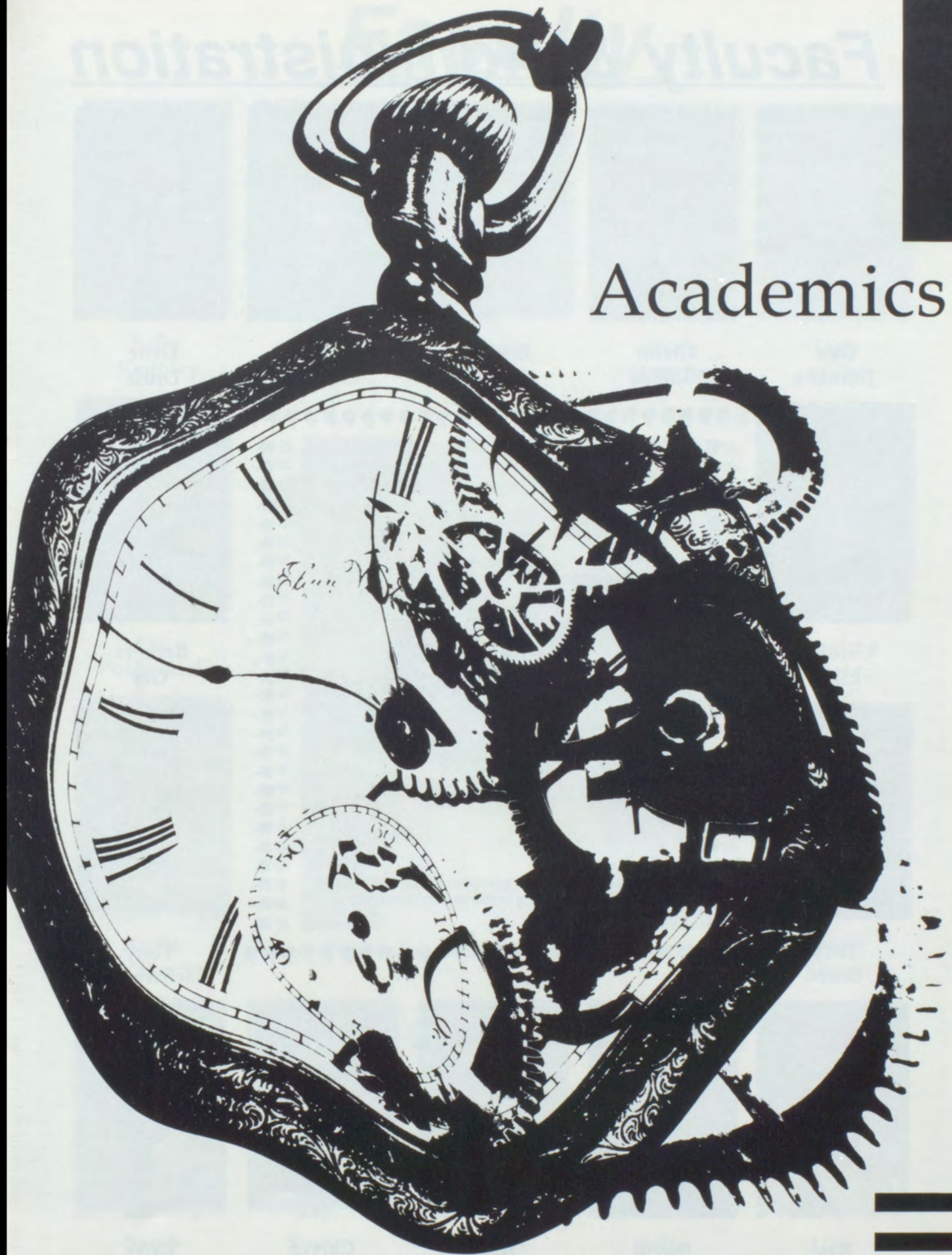

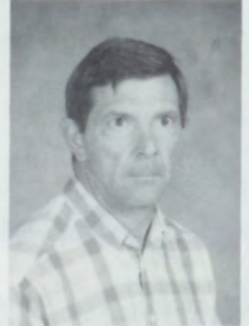

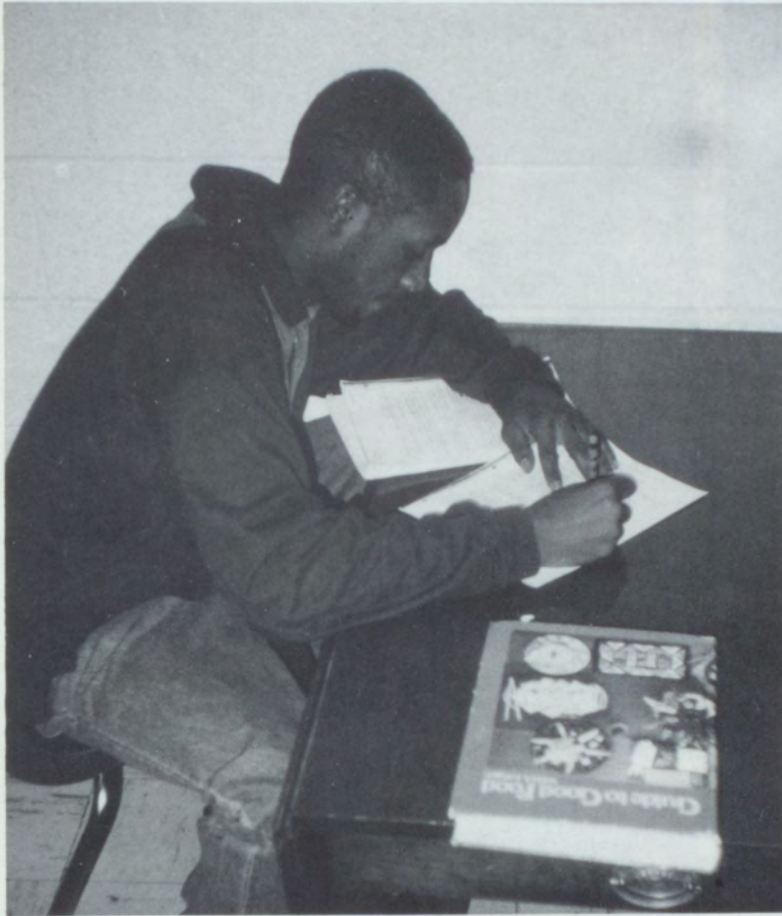

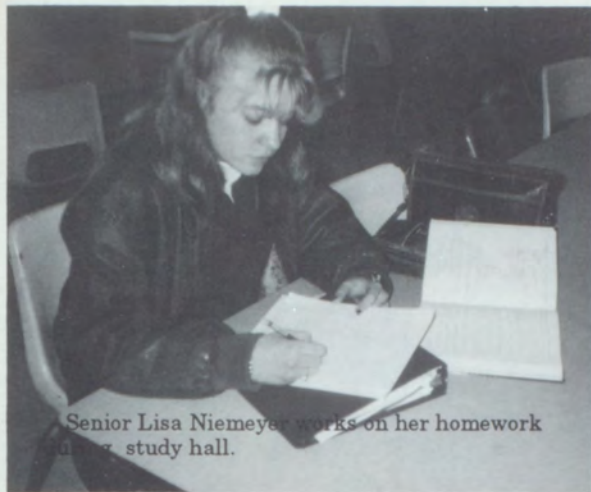

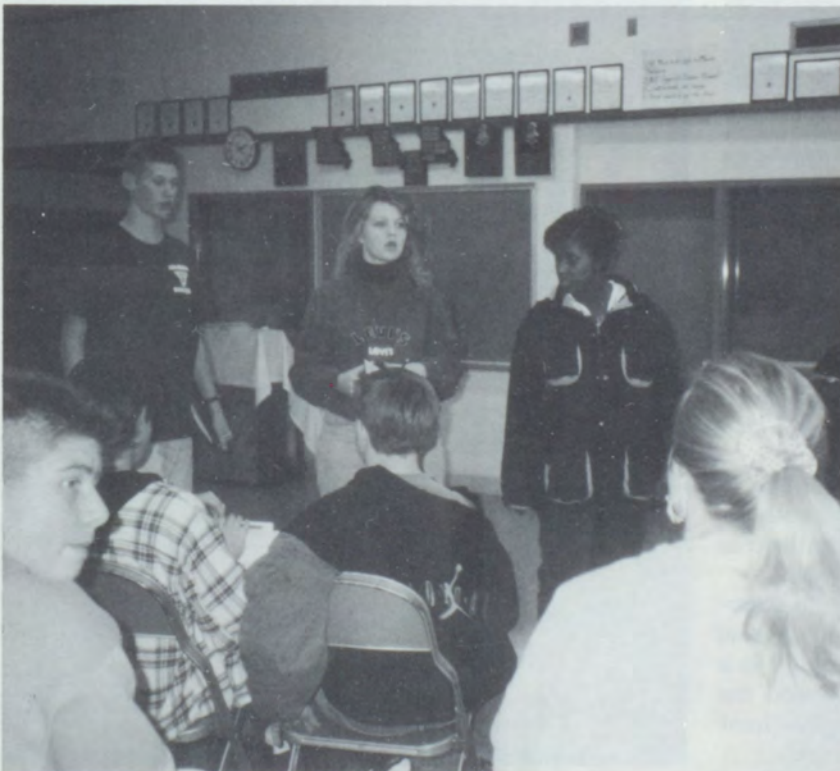

Some of the paintings in the art hallway have been defaced and it distorts the true meaning of the artwork.

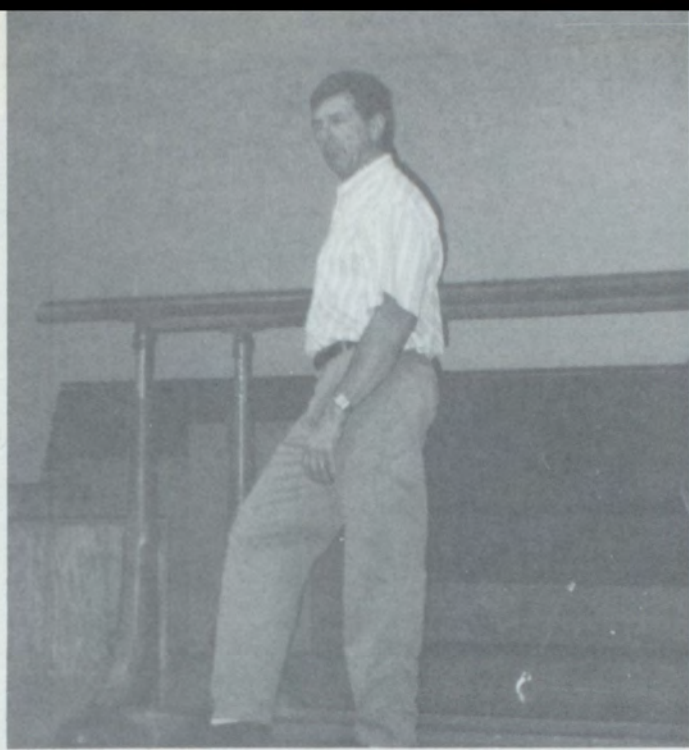
"I think it shows the general disrespect and rudeness of some of our students. It is a shame that they would not respect other peoples' hard work," Mrs. Logan said.

The famous Midwest musical drama of "Oklahoma" was performed by LHS students this year.

Based on Lynn Riggs' 1931 play "*Green Grow the Lilacs*," "OKLAHOMA!" is set in Indian Territory soon after the turn of the century. The story is mostly concerned with whether the decent Curley McLain (Joseph O'Donnell) or the menacing Jud Fry (Brad Jamison) will take Laurey Williams (Hilari Ditch) to the box social. Because she's angry, Laurey chooses Jud, but she really loves Curley, and they soon make plans to marry. At their wedding, there is a joyous celebration of Oklahoma's impending statehood. 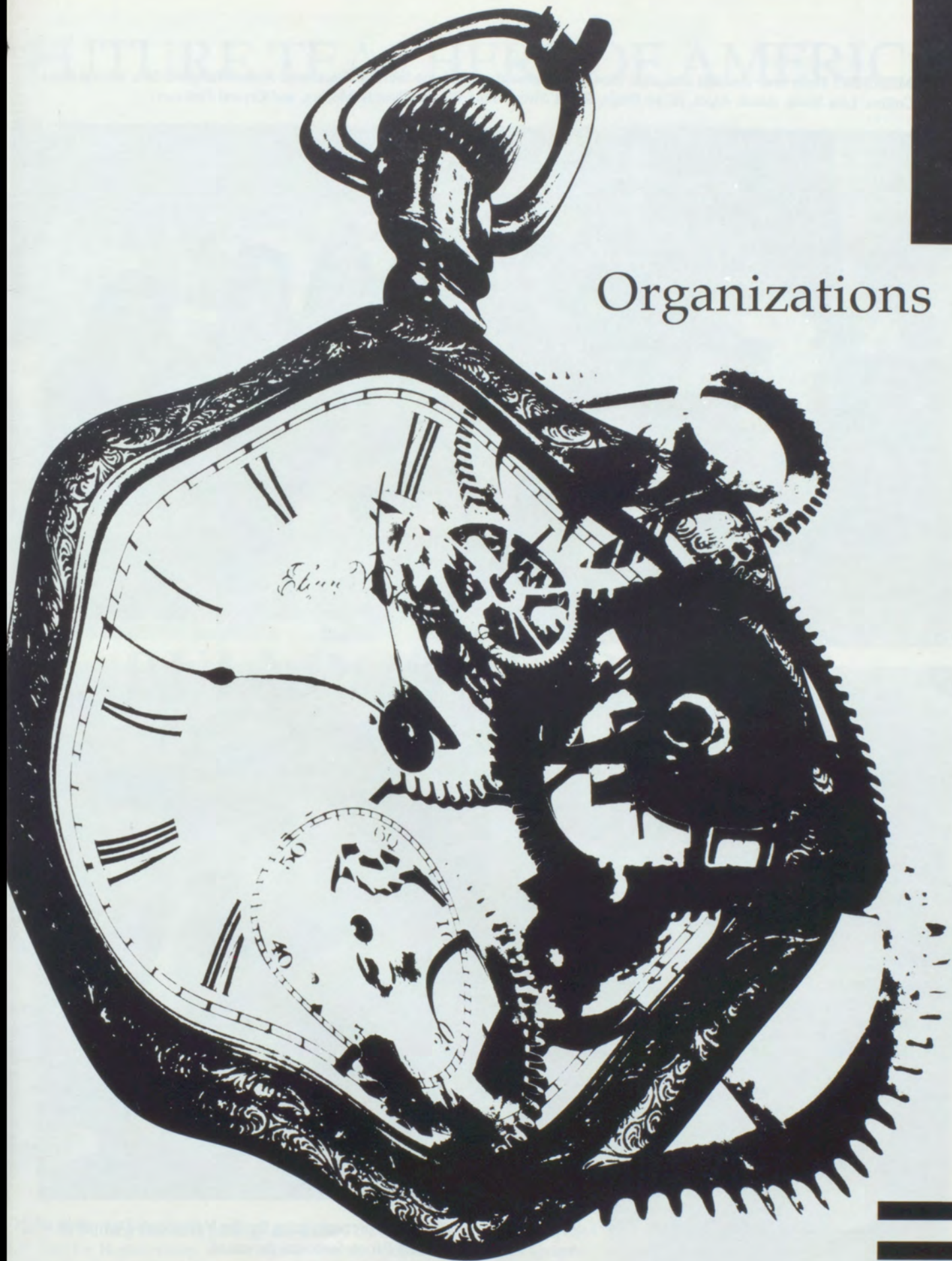

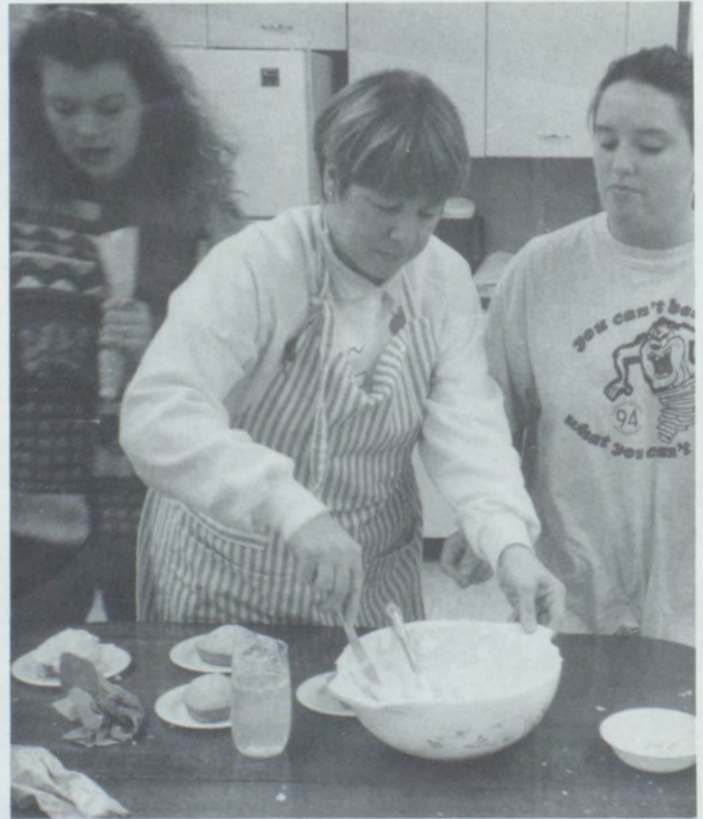

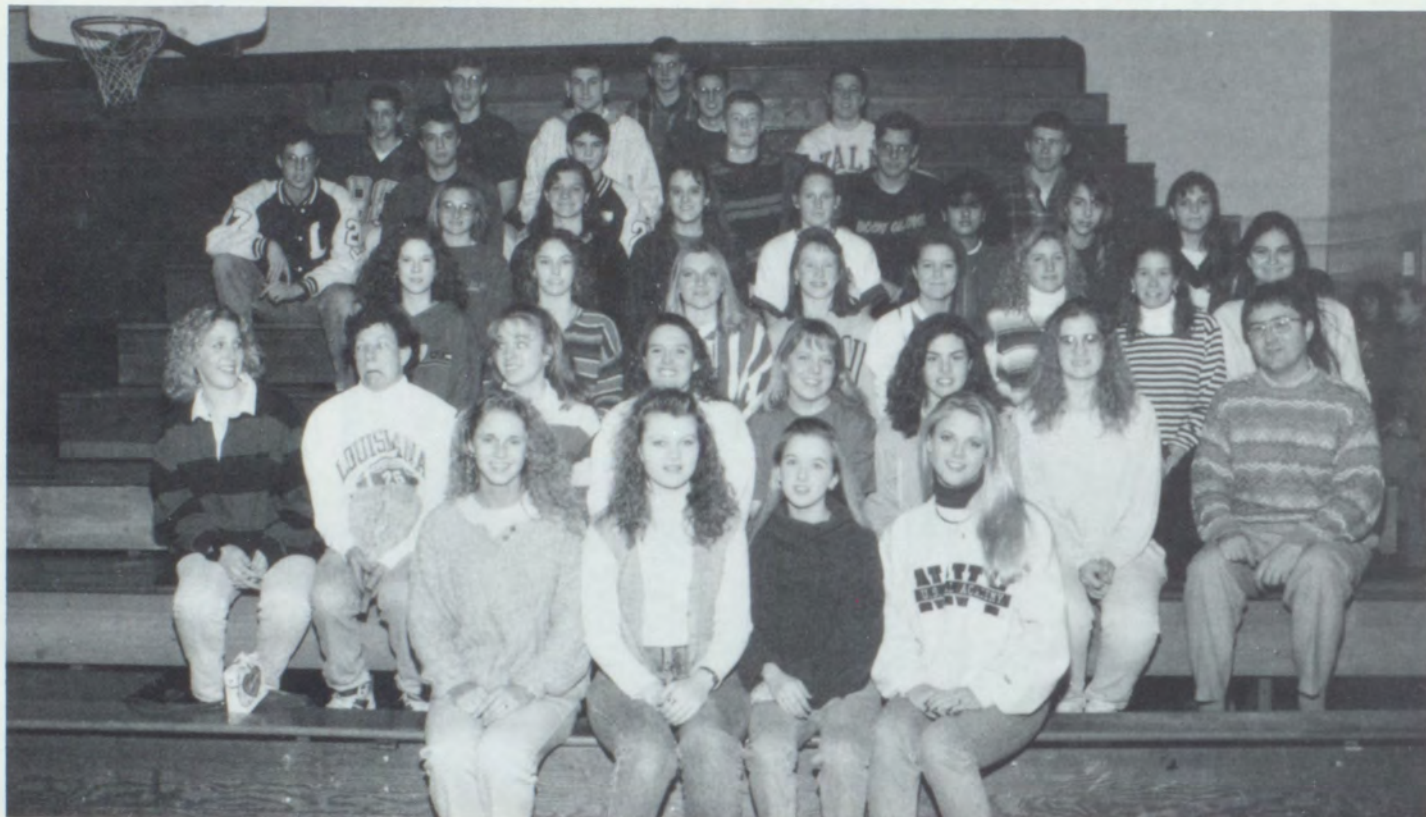

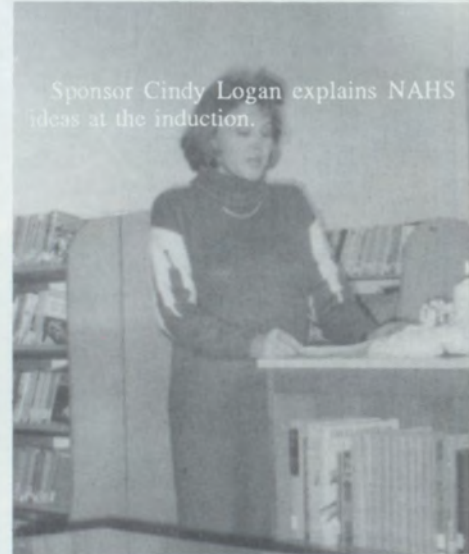

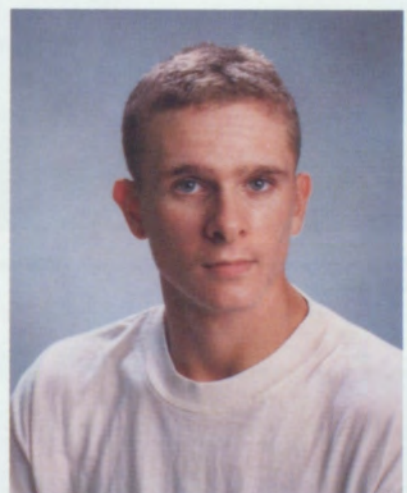

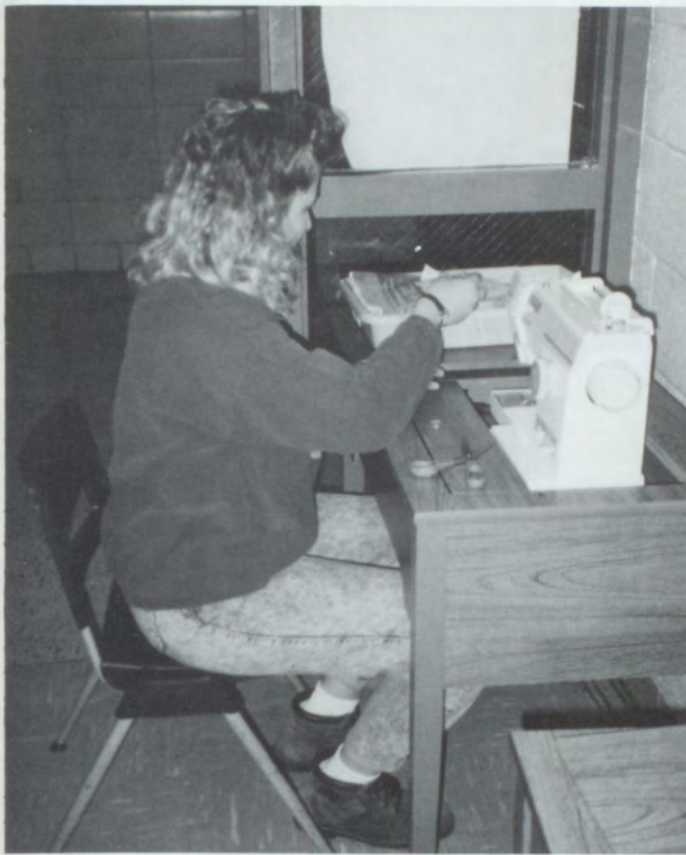

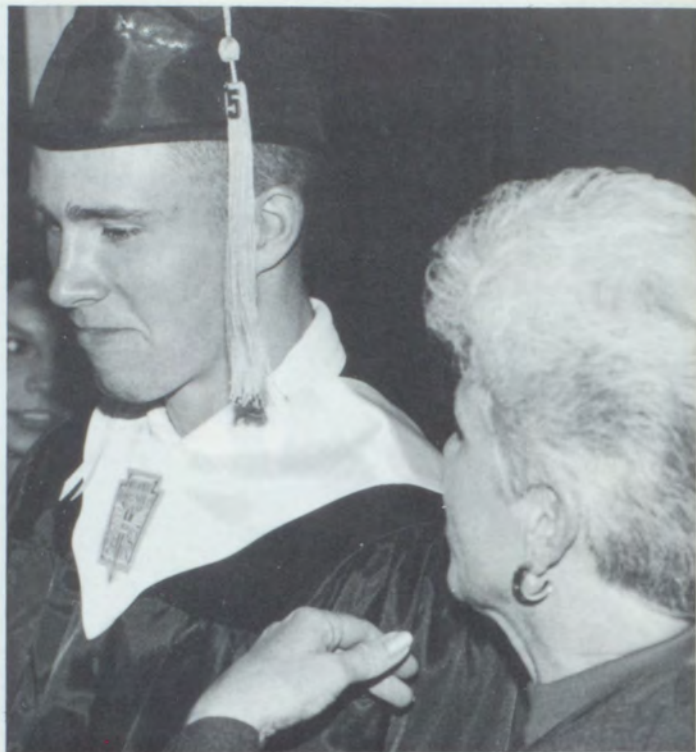

## Big dance costs big bucks

Every year when Prom rolls around, stores roll in big bucks. From dresses and tuxes to dinner, it tends to get expensive.

For girls it all starts with a dress that can range from \$50 up to \$700 plus.

"I spent \$200 on my dress this year. I spent more on accessories," senior Crystal Hanners said.

Then you have to get shoes, which range in price depending on what kind you get. For a pair of dyed shoes, the average price is \$20, but to be a little fancier and get sequenced shoes, it can cost \$60 or more. But the outfit is still not complete. You still need accessories such as hose, jewelry, gloves, and a purse.

"I spent \$363 on dress, shoes, jewelry, and a purse, and then there's the \$10 for the After Prom party," junior Amber Tipton said.

FlowerShop prices range from \$2-\$4.50. At Louisiana Flowers and Gifts, prices range from \$1.25-\$10.

For the guys it also puts a serious dent in their bank accounts. They have the cost of the tuxedo which ranges from \$45-\$85. Then they have to purchase a corsage for their dates. They range from \$3.50-\$12.50, or \$15 for all roses at Rainbow Flower Shop. At Louisiana Flowers and Gifts, the prices range from \$5-\$20. It all depends on the flowers you want to get.

Then on Prom day, it is traditional that the guy treat his date to dinner. With Quincy and St. Louis being the most popular places to go, guys have to pay for transportation and the dinner. The cost for dinner depends on how nice of a restaurant you go to.

When you arrive at the dance, you can have your picture taken, which also adds to the cost. Prices range from \$7-\$45. After all this, Prom-goers still have to buy after prom party tickets which cost \$10 per person.

Is it really worth spending this much money? Some students think so.

"I think it's worth it because you only get to do it twice," Amber said.

"It's a night you'll remember for the rest of your life," junior Melissa Love said.

Some student find a cheaper alternative to these expenses...they borrow.

"All my stuff was free," junior Carolyn Castiglia said. "I have about six aunts that are close to my age, and two second cousins, so I get a great variety to chose from."

"I spent no money; I borrowed everything," junior Courtney Lockard said.

And what do you do with your dress and accessories after Prom is over?

Many students are choosing to sell them and use that money toward a dress for the next year, rather than just let the old one hang in their closets.

Many feel it's worth the cost.

"I spent a lot of money, mostly for the tuxedo, but it's worth it because Prom was fun," junior Bryan Andrews said.

to go around."

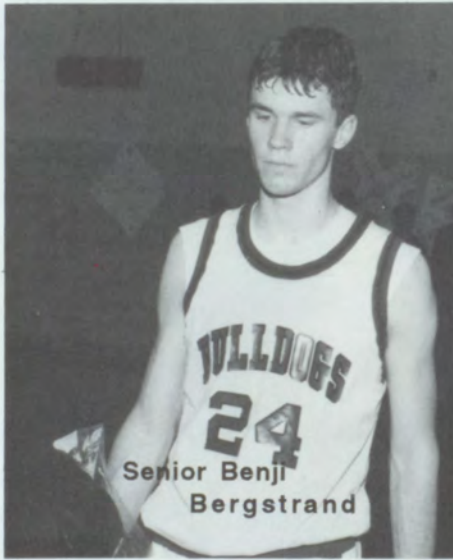
This year instead of having the usual voting of one senior girl and one senior boy being queen and king this year all seniors playing basketball were honored for their hard work and dedication.

CO vice-president Julie Alexander said.

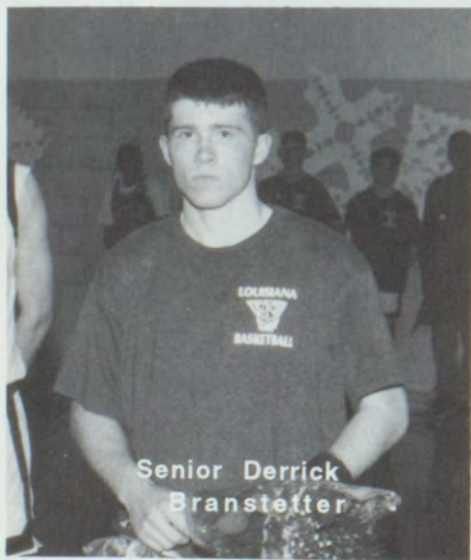

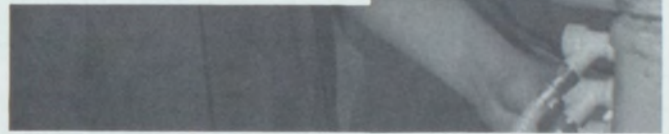

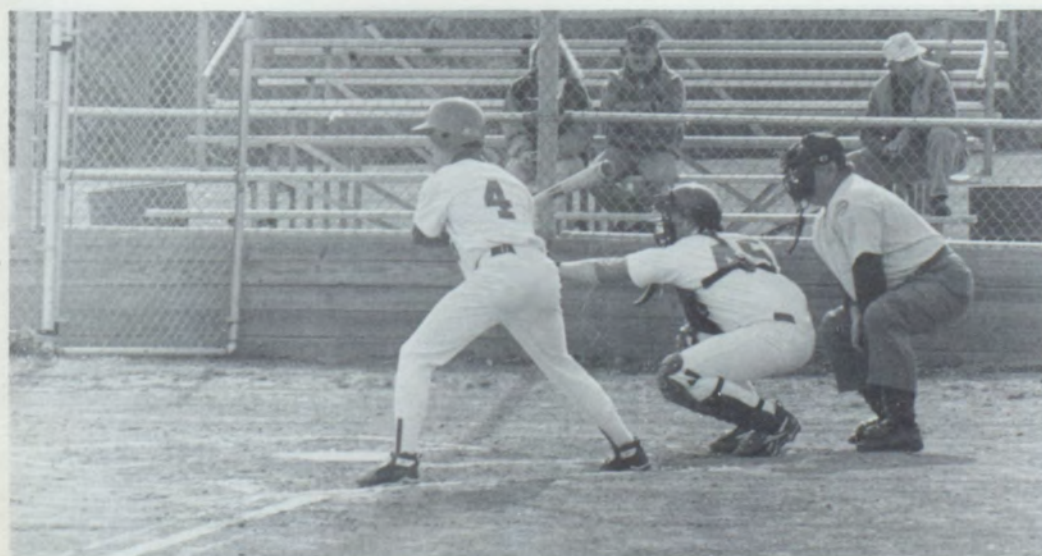

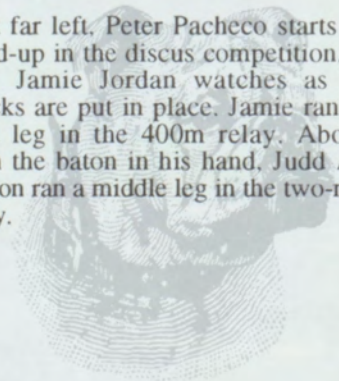

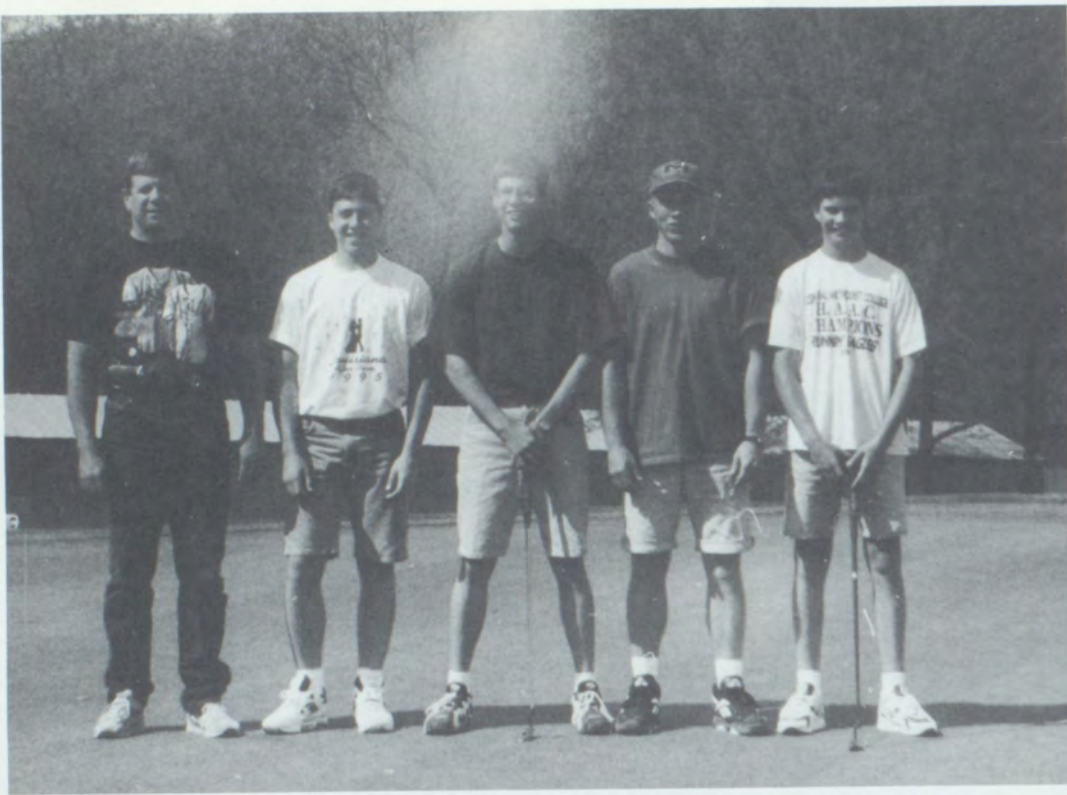

The winning streak was cut short on September 16 as North Calloway doubled the Bulldogs by beating them 18-6.

Still, this didn't keep Louisiana's hopes down for a winning season. On September 23 Maplewood came to Louisiana for a short visit. For them it wasn't short enough. The Bulldogs pulverized Maplewood with the score of 44-0. This was the first shutout of the season.

The next game, Homecoming, was to be played on September 30 and school spirit was on the rise all week long. The game was a vice versa of the previous week as Monroe City started what would turn into a four-game losing streak for the

Bulldogs. Monroe City won the game 41-6.

On October 7 the Bulldogs traveled to Macon were scoreless as Louisiana was beaten 27-0.

The game on October 14 was played at Cunningham Field as Centralia stole another victory from Louisiana, beating them 33-16.

The fourth and final loss came during the first game of Districts. This was not only the final loss, but also the final home game. Palmyra came and held the Bulldogs to only a field goal, beating them 21-3.
