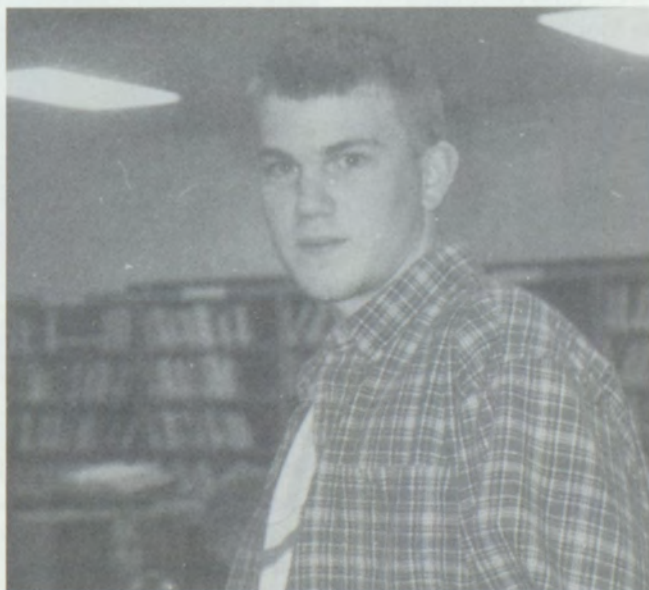

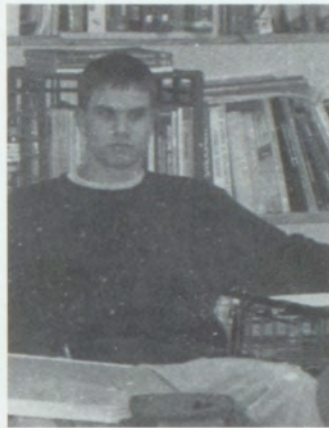

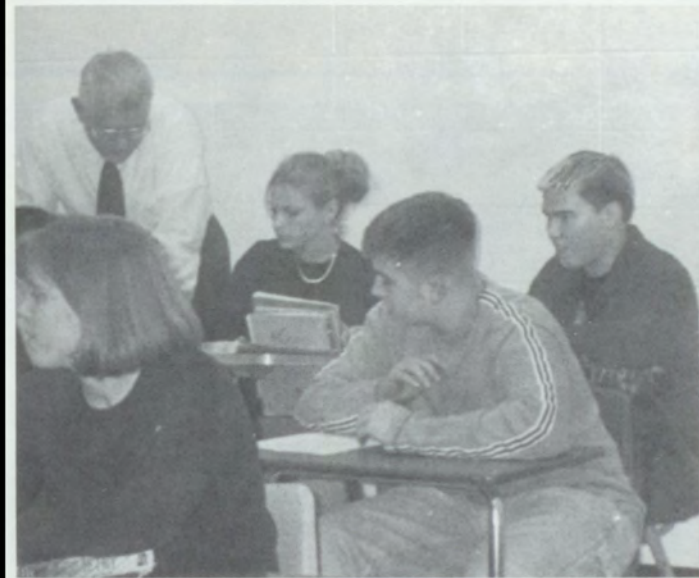

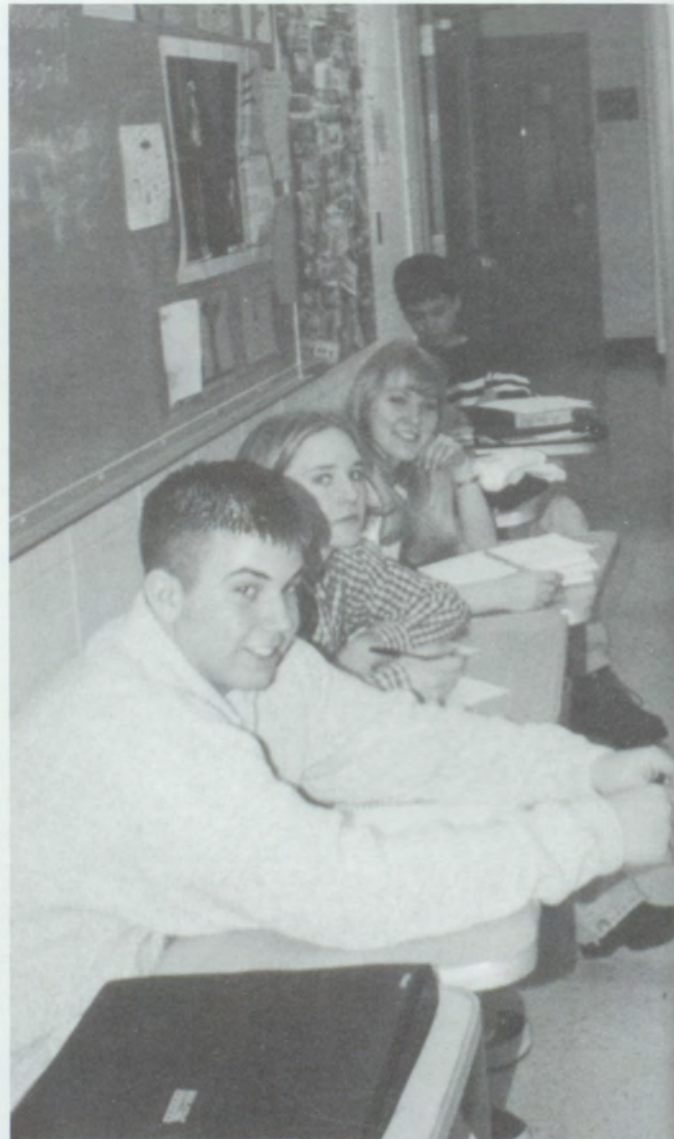

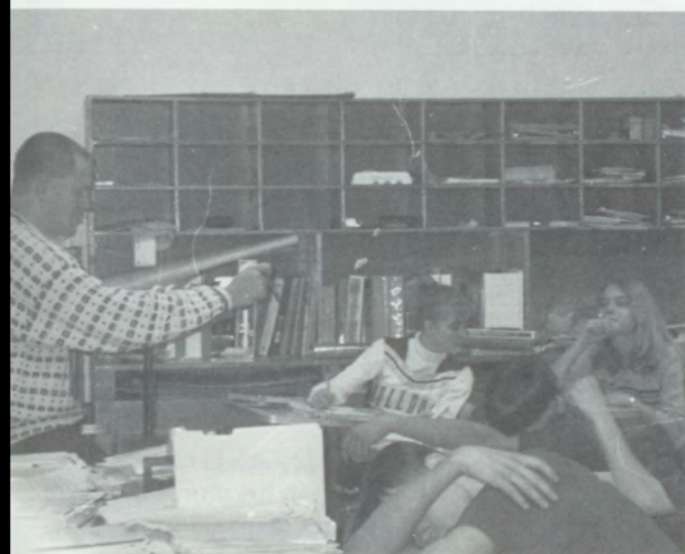

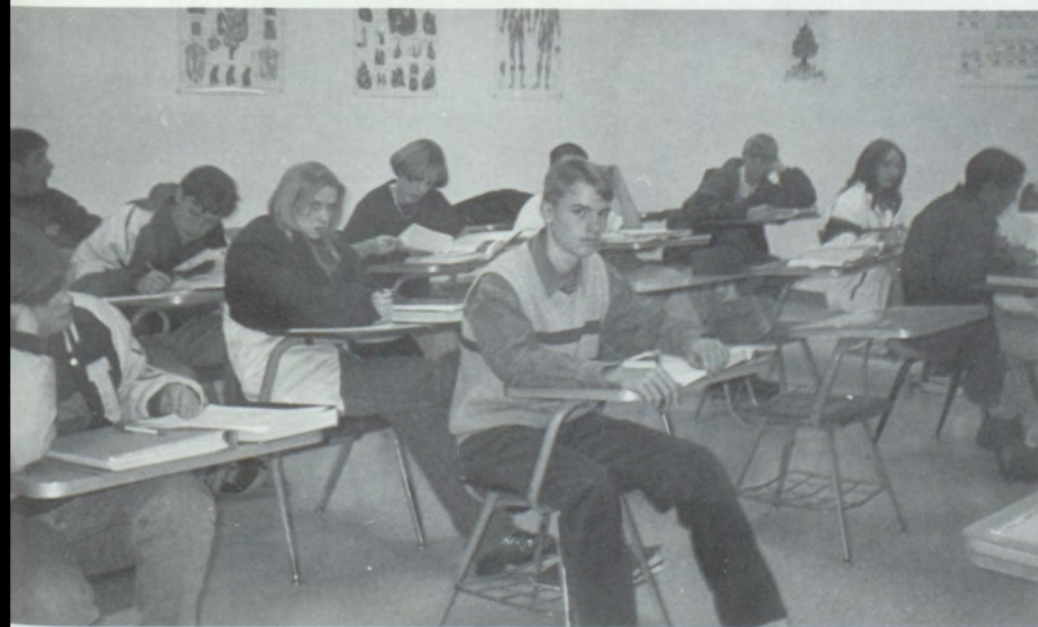

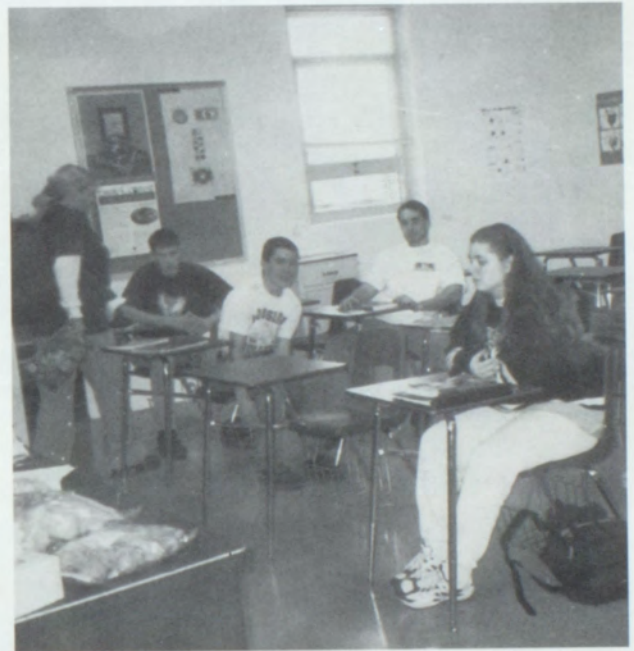

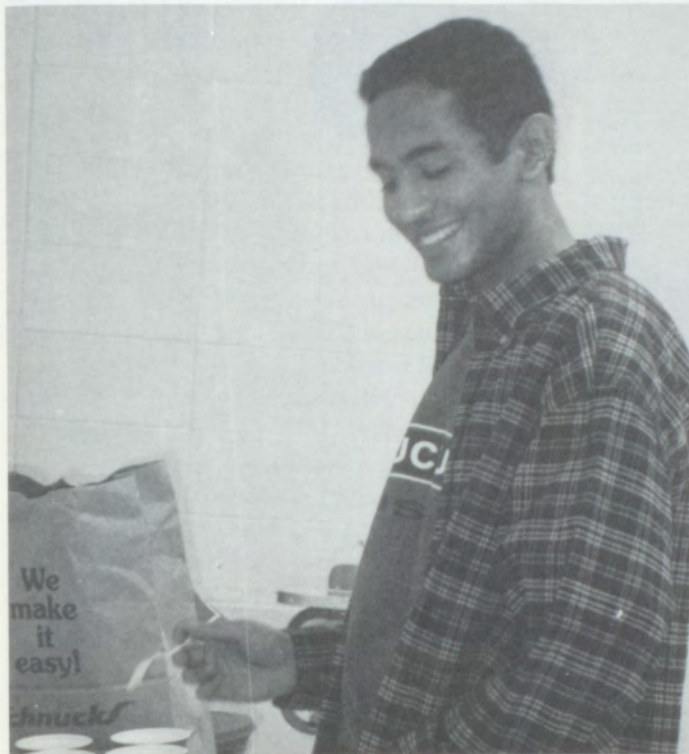

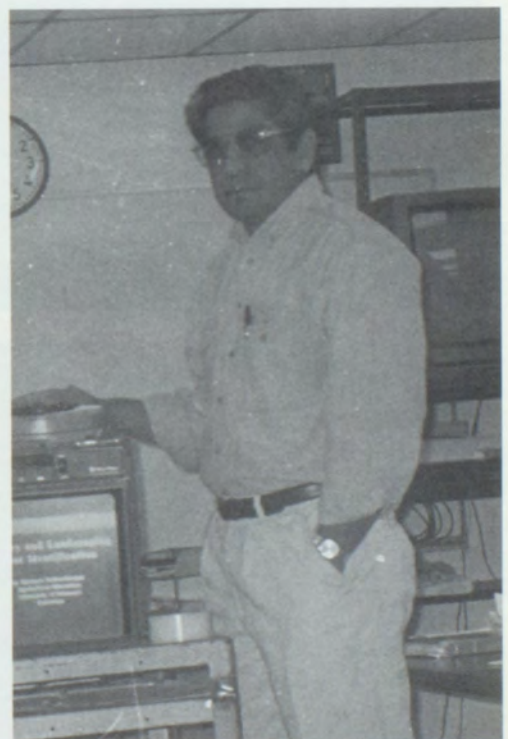
All classes in vocational agriculture teach students agricultural techniques, mechanics, and leadership that can be used for years to come.

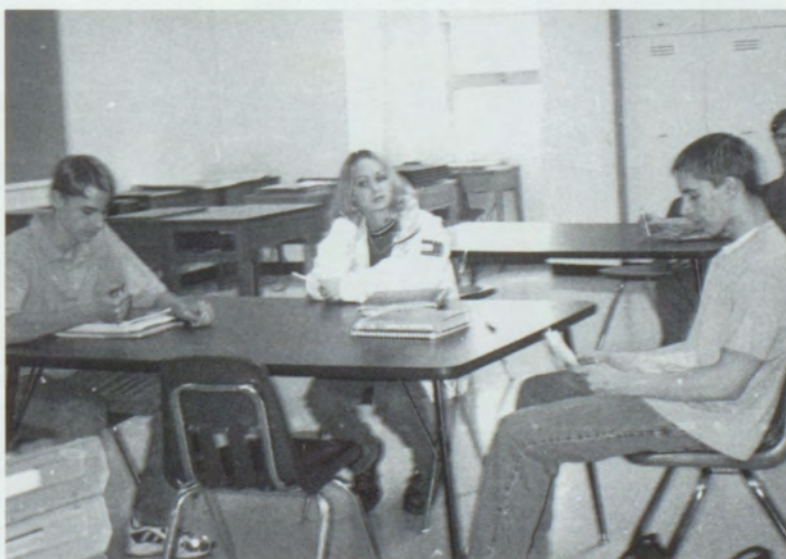

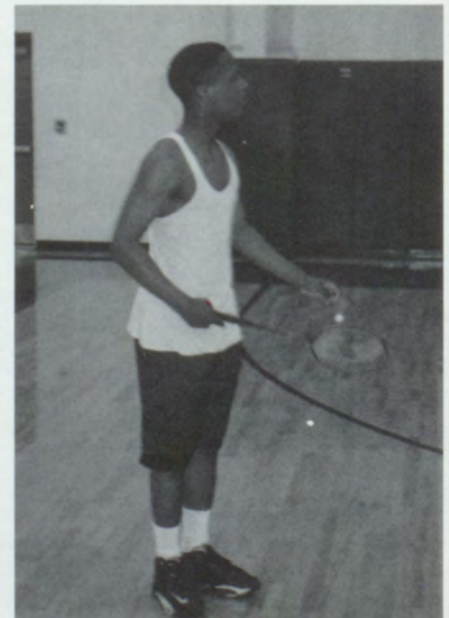

Typing is a course in which students learn the keyboard, machine parts, typing principles, and various styles of letters and reports.

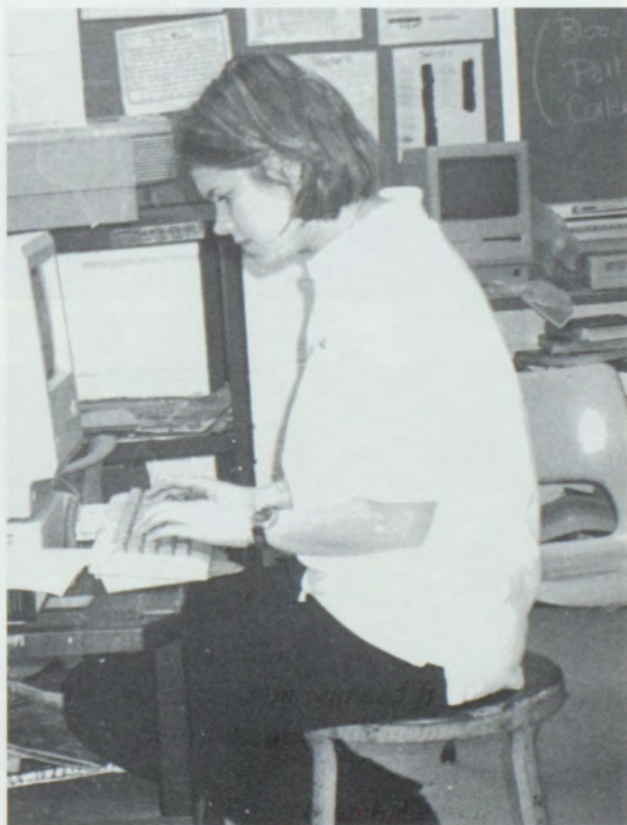

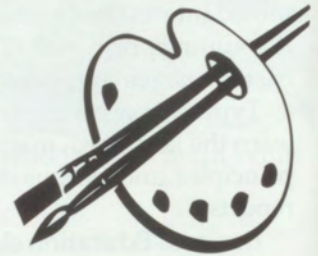

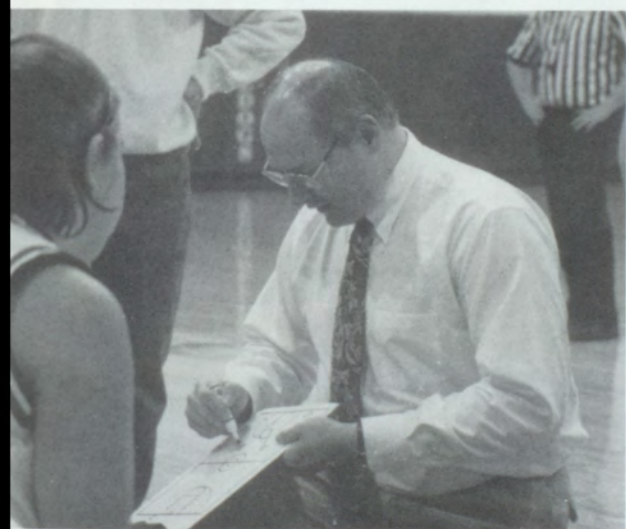

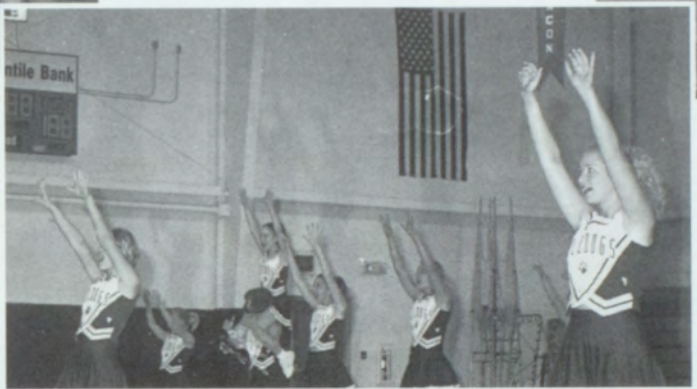

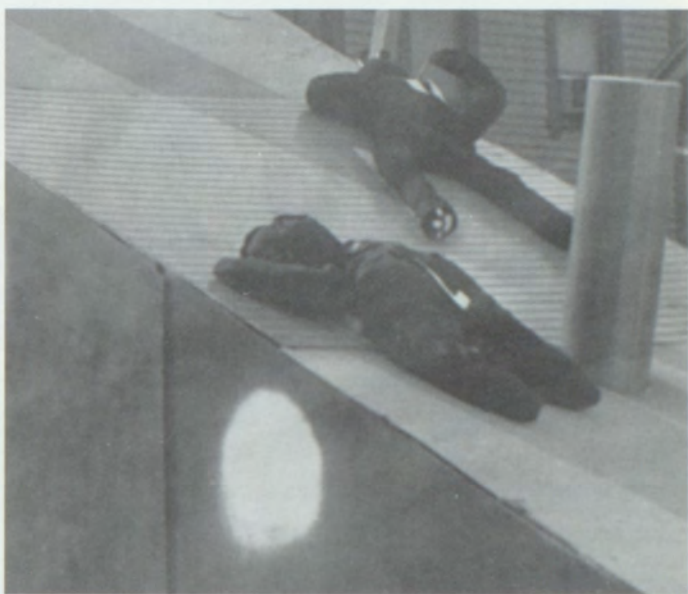
