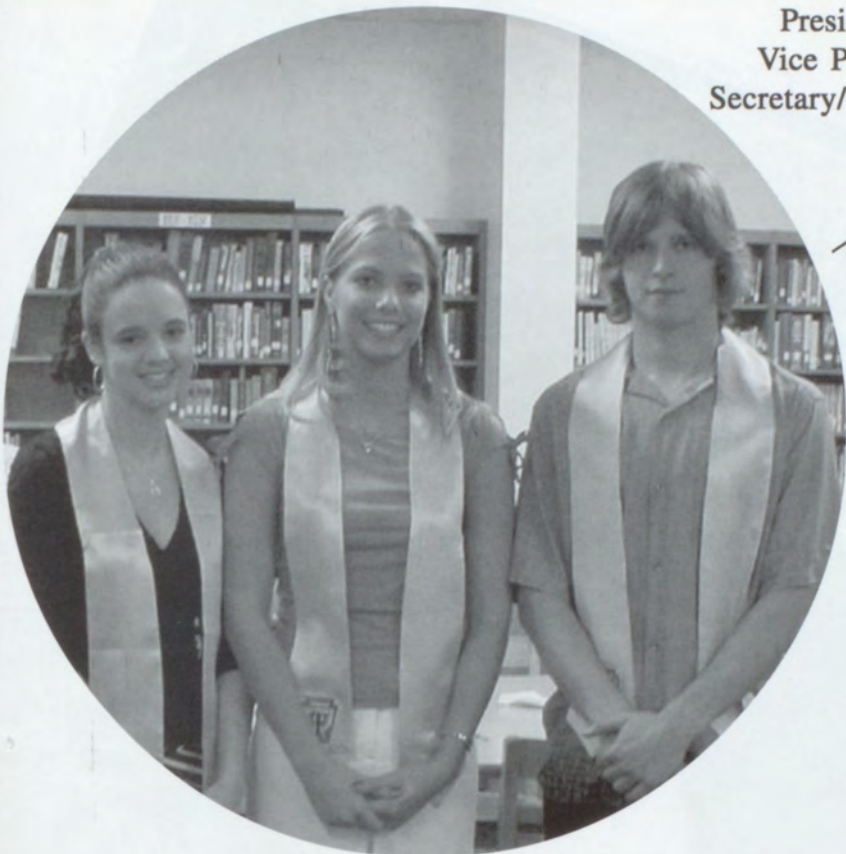

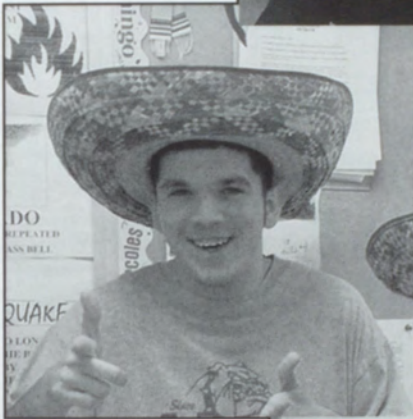

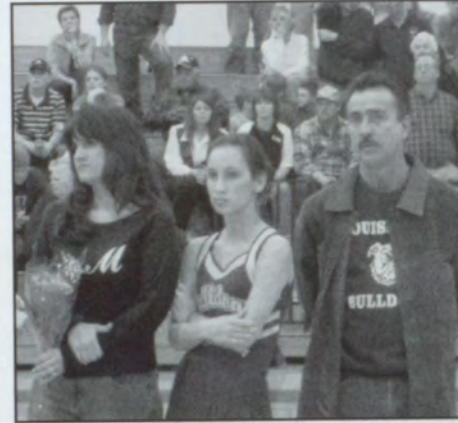

record good enough for 2nd for the second year in a row.

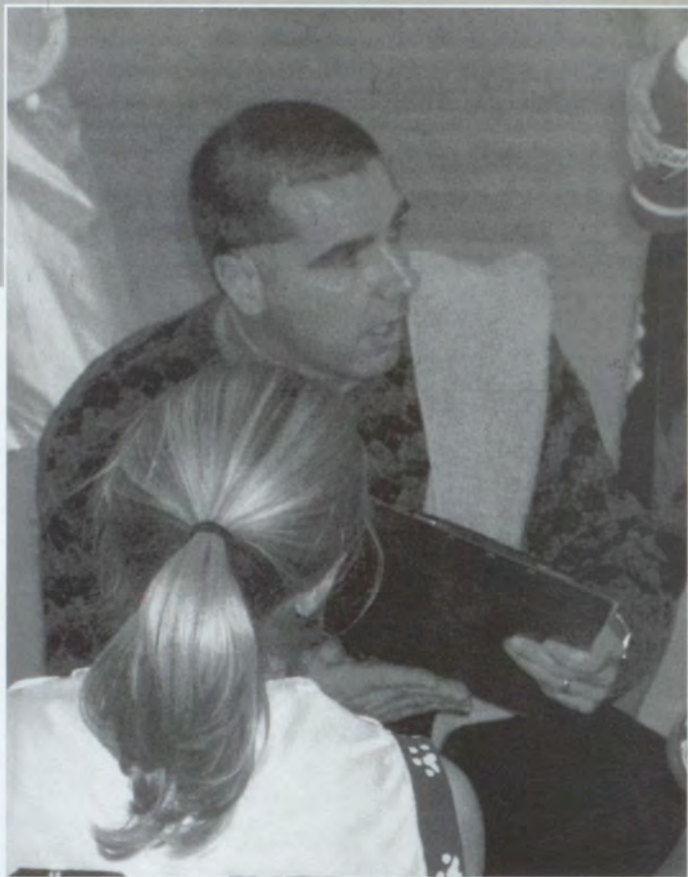

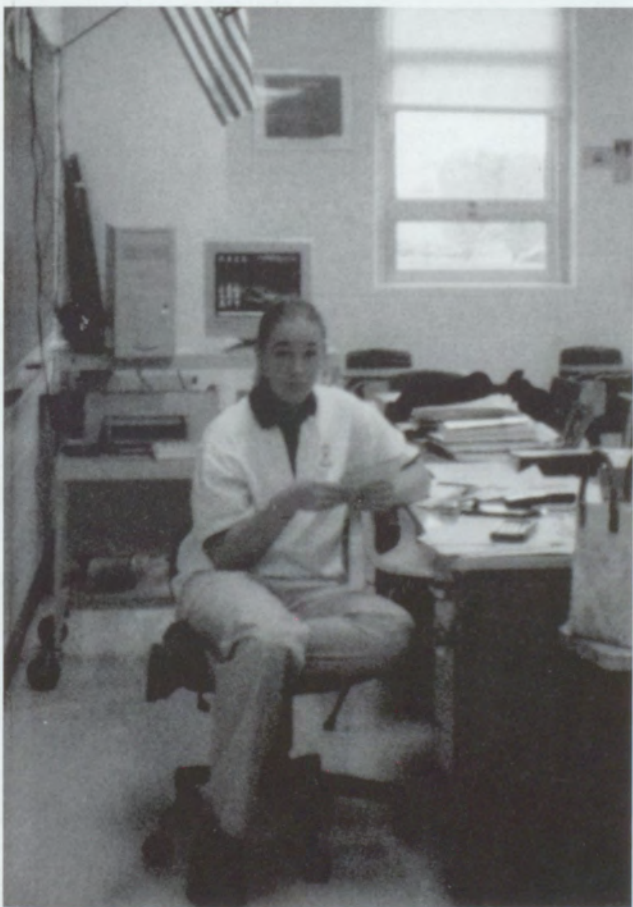
